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Notes

1. JW welcomed the group to the eighth meeting of this guideline development group (GDG). Apologies were received from Claire Pesterfield, Jacqueline Double and Juliet Kenny.
2. JW asked all the GDG members and other attendees to declare any new interests that they had accrued since GDG 7 and reiterate any interests declared previously that were relevant to the meeting agenda.

7. PJ presented the health economic model for the question on ketone monitoring for children and young people with type 1 diabetes. The group suggested some amendments which could be made.
8. PJ and FB presented the health economic model for the question on multiple daily insulin injections compared with mixed insulin injections for children and young people with type 1 diabetes. The group suggested some amendments which could be made.
9. SB presented the review on dietetic advice for children and young people with type 2 diabetes. The group discussed the findings of the review.
10. JW led the group through the process of interpreting the evidence and drafting recommendations for dietetic advice for children and young people with type 2 diabetes. Notes were made live on screen.
11. SB presented the review on HbA_{1c} targets for children and young people with type 2 diabetes. The group discussed the findings of the review.
12. JW led the group through the process of interpreting the evidence and drafting recommendations for HbA_{1c} targets for children and young people with type 2 diabetes. Notes were made live on screen.
13. The group considered the review on blood glucose targets for children and young people with type 1 diabetes. The group discussed the recommendations and amended them.
14. As there was time available, KW presented an unscheduled item. KW presented the review on structured education for children and young people with type 2 diabetes. The group discussed the findings of the review.
15. JW led the group through the process of interpreting the evidence and drafting recommendations for structured education for children and young people with type 2 diabetes. Notes were made live on screen.
16. PJ gave a presentation on the IMS CORE economic model which will be used to underpin the health economic analysis for some of the review questions.
