A stakeholder commented on how it is important to recognise that cognitive impairment may impact on the person's ability to retain information and make decisions on their care. MS professionals should have the knowledge to recognise this and support the patient and their carers appropriately by sign posting to other services for support.

In recommendation 1.2.9 the guideline highlights the importance of discussing advance care planning if you expect the person's cognitive status will deteriorate.

A stakeholder asked that the guideline highlight the potential impact of cognitive impairment (executive functioning) on mental capacity to make decisions, which may not be initially evident without a thorough assessment.

Recommendation 1.2.18 refers to the NICE guideline on decision-making and mental capacity.
