2. New declarations of interest were received from Nick Kosky, Naomi Lumsdaine, Julia Tabreham, Stephen Habgood, Sunil Lad and Steve Pilling.
3. The minutes and related actions from the previous GC were reviewed and accepted.

OMV, the systematic reviewer on the guideline, suggested the possibility of adapting interventions for health promotion from other NICE guidance as there are not many RCTs specific to the criminal justice system.
4. NK, the chair of the guideline, presented the updated criminal justice system pathway and requested that the GC confirms comments via email.
5. Ken Elliott, a representative from NoMs, attended GC4 and gave an overview of the NoMs delivery service.
6. There are no RCTs for acquired cognitive impairment or personality disorder specific to the criminal justice system. A few options for handling these review questions were discussed and a proposal will be presented at the next GC.
7. OMV, the systematic reviewer on the guideline, gave a presentation on non-RCT evidence for psychosocial interventions for paraphilias.
8. ES, the health economist on this guideline, gave a presentation on the health economics of paraphilias.
9. RBr, the chair for the Physical health in prisons guideline, gave an update on the progress of the guideline.
