



# Durvalumab in combination for untreated extensive-stage small-cell lung cancer (terminated appraisal)

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## Advice

NICE is unable to make a recommendation about the use in the NHS of durvalumab in combination for untreated extensive-stage small-cell lung cancer because AstraZeneca withdrew its evidence submission. The company has confirmed that it does not intend to make a submission for the appraisal because the technology is unlikely to be a cost-effective use of NHS resources.

### Information

If NHS organisations wish to consider durvalumab in combination for untreated extensive-stage small-cell lung cancer, they should follow the advice on rational local decision making in the <a href="NHS Constitution for England">NHS Constitution for England</a> and the <a href="NHS Commissioning Board and Clinical Commissioning Groups">NHS Commissioning Board and Clinical Commissioning Groups</a> (Responsibilities and Standing Rules) Regulations 2012.
