Introduction

Proposals to review Guidance – RCN Response

The Royal College of Nursing welcomes the opportunity to comment on proposals to review NICE Technology Appraisal Guidance No. 78; on the use of fluid filled thermal balloon and microwave endometrial ablation for the treatment of menstrual bleeding.

We agree with NICE's proposal to defer the review of the above guidance for another two years. It would make sense to review the evidence for the above technology appraisal guidance at the same time as when the Heavy Menstrual Bleeding guideline is reviewed in two years time. The Impedance-controlled endometrial ablation for menorrhagia technology appraisal guidance will be due for a review in 2008; this will allow all the heavy menstrual bleeding ablation technologies to be appraised at the same time – this therefore, seems like a practical and reasonable plan.
