The impact on equality has been assessed during guidance development according to the principles of the NICE equality policy.

The groups identified in the equalities impact assessment during scoping were considered through the development of the guideline, however it was agreed no separate recommendations for these groups were required.

It was noted that the majority of the evidence for chronic primary pain is in women. The committee agreed that this is because fibromyalgia is more commonly diagnosed in women, however there is no reason that effectiveness of interventions would differ between males and females therefore the recommendations are not required to differ. 3.3 Have the Committee's considerations of equality issues been described in the guideline for consultation, and, if so, where?

Consideration of equalities issues has been detailed in the committee's discussion of the evidence for the recommendations on communication.

3.4 Do the preliminary recommendations make it more difficult in practice for a specific group to access services compared with other groups? If so, what are the barriers to, or difficulties with, access for the specific group?
