Minutes

Introductions and apologies. The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting, introductions

David Kernick and Claire Turner.

The GDG were reminded to update their declarations of interest if any changes had occurred since the last meeting. Two GDG members notified changes. Due to some non-personal pecuniary conflicts of interest in the area of non-pharmacological treatments (not specific to headache) it was agreed that Martin Underwood would not Chair the afternoon session of the meeting when recommendations were made. Norma O'Flynn would Chair this part of the

meeting.

- 4. **Prophylactic non-pharmacological treatment of primary headaches psychological therapies**Dons Coleston-Shields presented an introduction to the use of psychological therapies for the treatment of primary headaches. ZN presented the clinical evidence. The GDG had the opportunity to ask questions about the use of psychological therapies and the evidence.
- 5. **Prophylactic non-pharmacological treatment of primary headaches dietary supplements**SB presented the clinical evidence for the prophylactic pharmacological treatment of primary headaches with dietary supplements. There was no economic evidence to report.
- 6. **Prophylactic non-pharmacological treatment of primary headaches herbal remedies**SB presented the clinical evidence for the prophylactic pharmacological treatment of primary headaches with dietary supplements. There was no economic evidence to report.
