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1. Introduction

- c. In people after stroke who can walk, what is the clinical and cost effectiveness of treadmill plus body support versus treadmill only on improving walking?

3. Clinical Questions - Review protocols

The GDG discussed and agreed the review protocols for clinical questions related to Intensive Speech therapy, listener advice for people after stroke with aphasia, intensive occupational therapy.
