## Therapeutic monitoring of TNF-alpha inhibitors in rheumatoid arthritis

The impact on equality has been assessed during this assessment according to the principles of the NICE Equality scheme.

Rheumatoid arthritis can have a substantial and long-term adverse effect on a person's ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities. Therefore, people with rheumatoid arthritis may be covered under the disability provision of the Equality Act (2010).

Therapeutic monitoring may also be helpful in people who have paused treatment due to pregnancy or treatment for other co-morbidities, and have subsequently re-started treatment with TNF- $\alpha$  inhibitors.

2. What is the preliminary view as to what extent these potential equality issues need addressing by the Committee?

The potential equality issues will be noted by the Committee and inform discussions where appropriate.

3. Has any change to the draft scope been agreed to highlight potential equality issues?

The potential equality issues have been included in the equalities section of the scope.
