The above experts have been recruited to support the assessment by providing evidence and their views and experience. Experts are recruited from a range of backgrounds including:

- health and social care professionals
- non-health and social care professionals (such as scientists, software specialists, data analysts, engineers or people with procurement or other technical experience, as needed)
- people with a condition and their carers, who can provide information about the impact of both the condition and the technology being assessed (NICE refers to these as People and Communities Partners).
- commissioning experts.

Experts are typically selected during the scoping period but can also be selected later in the process if needed, for example, if gaps are identified in the knowledge and expertise needed by a committee.
