At the stakeholder workshop the following populations were identified as having potential equality issues and should be considered within the development of scope:

- Older people
- Pregnant women
- Black and Minority Ethnic
- Men

It was noted that there may be challenges for these groups to be identified and diagnosed with ME/CFS and then to access support services. Older people and pregnant women might need extra support.

At the stakeholder workshop people in different locations, particularly in rural settings were identified as having potential challenges in accessing services. This could be a

result of transport availability or lack of services in the area.
It was noted there could be challenges for people in low socio-economic groups accessing services.
1.2 What is the preliminary view on the extent to which these potential equality issues need addressing by the Committee? For example, if population groups, treatments or settings are excluded from the scope, are these exclusions justified – that is, are the reasons legitimate and the exclusion proportionate?

Stakeholder comment advised that there are potential equality issues in relation to access to diagnosis and treatment for people who share many of the characteristics protected under equality Law. The characteristics particularly mentioned were socio economic factors, ethnicity, gender and sexual orientation. Stakeholders considered that the difficulties that children and young people have in access to care as a significant equality issue.

People with ME/CFS may have long-term and substantial health impairment sufficient to be considered to have a disability.
