1. Welcome and objectives for the meeting

The Chair, Marie Burnham (MB) welcomed the committee to day 1 of the fourteenth weight management guideline committee meeting and informed the committee of the apologies noted above.

The Chair asked all committee members to verbally declare any interests that have arisen since the last meeting. Helen Parretti declared the following new interest:

The Chair and development team reviewed these prior to the meeting and noted that the interests declared did not prevent the Grace from fully participating in the meeting.

Finally, MB and committee members reviewed the minutes from committee meeting 13 and agreed them as an accurate record of the meeting.

2. Review question 2.4 – What are the effectiveness and cost effectiveness of healthy living programmes for preventing overweight or obesity in children and young people?

The Chair (MB) introduced colleagues from the Universities of Durham (Sophie Phillips) and Carolyn Summerbell) and Bristol (Julian Higgins). They provided an update on the research they had done for Cochrane which would support our recommendations for healthy living

programmes for children and young people.

Julian began by giving a brief update of his evidence reviews, which covered ages 5 - 18, taking questions from the committee. He was then followed by Sophie and Carolyn who gave their full evidence review presentation which covered the 2 - 4-year-old age bracket.

After taking questions from the committee on how they had conducted their reviews and the kind of evidence that had been drawn out, MB thanked the university staff for their work and support and moved to the next item on the agenda.

3. Review question 1.3 – What approaches are effective and cost-effective in identifying overweight and obesity in children and young people, particularly those in black, Asian and minority ethnic groups?/What are the barriers and facilitators to identifying overweight and obesity in children and young people, particularly those in black, Asian and minority ethnic groups?

The Chair then introduced Michellie Young (MYO) the Technical Analyst leading on the review questions covering the identification of obesity and the uptake of weight management services.

MYO focused on the identification question for her first item, specifically from the perspective of servicing children and young people. She recapped the recommendations the committee had made so far, covered the re-runs of evidence searches she had recently performed and then asked the committee if they had questions or suggestions.

After some discussion from the committee, where they offered their feedback, MB thanked MYO for her work on this review question and moved to the next item on the agenda.

4. Review question 2.3 – What intervention components and approaches are effective, cost effective and acceptable for children and young people living with overweight or obesity?

The Chair introduced Shreya Shukla (SS), Senior Technical Analyst. With support from MYO she presented a recap of the recommendations made so far for our review question to cover weight management interventions for children and young people, as well as presenting the findings of the recently rerun evidence searches.

During the subsequent discussion the committee offered further refinements on how the recommendations were written, ordered and presented.

The Chair then thanked SS and MYO for their presentation before moving to the penultimate item on the agenda.

5. Review question 1.4 – What approaches are effective and cost-effective in increasing uptake of weight management services in children and young people, particularly those in black, Asian and minority ethnic groups?/What are the barriers and facilitators to increasing uptake of and adherence to weight management services in children and young people, particularly those in black, Asian and minority ethnic groups?

Picking up from her previous discussion around review question 1.3, MYO moved on to the uptake aspect of weight management services (RQ 1.4) again with a focus on children and young people.

As before, MYO recapped the recommendations the committee had made so far and covered the re-runs of evidence searches, before asking the committee if they had questions or suggestions.

The committee offered their input on how the wording, order and presentation of the recommendations could be further refined before the Chair moved the meeting to the final

item of the day.		

6. Next steps and any other business

The Chair thanked the committee for their time and input throughout the day and reminded them that day 2 of this meeting would begin at the same time on the following day.
