Scope for guideline update (starting 2025)

Ectopic pregnancy and miscarriage: diagnosis and initial management

NICE is updating its guideline on <u>Ectopic pregnancy and miscarriage:</u>
<u>diagnosis and initial management (NG126).</u> This was prompted by the update on the use of anti-D in the NICE guidance on abortion care.

The update will be developed using the methods and processes in <u>developing</u> NICE guidelines: the manual.

Who the guideline update covers

The update will cover the same groups as the current area of the guideline. These are:

- Women or pregnant people with pain or bleeding due to an ectopic pregnancy or because they are experiencing a miscarriage in the first trimester of pregnancy (that is, up to 12+6 completed weeks of pregnancy).
- Women or people who did not have pain and bleeding while they were pregnant, but who are found to have a missed miscarriage.

Equality considerations

A new <u>equality and health inequalities assessment impact</u> has been completed.

Settings

The guideline covers all health, mental health and social care settings in

which NHS care or social care is received or commissioned.

We will consider making recommendations or updating existing

recommendations on anti-D immunoglobulin prophylaxis.

Recommendations that are being retained from the current guideline may be

revised to update language, reflect current policy or practice, and to ensure

consistency.

Draft review questions

We have identified the following draft review questions. These may change

during guideline development, but the areas covered will remain as listed in

the final scope.

The areas covered and draft questions will be used to develop more detailed

review questions.

Topic of draft review question

1. Should anti-D immunoglobulin prophylaxis be given to women with a

threatened miscarriage, miscarriage or ectopic pregnancy in the first

trimester?

Economic aspects

We will take economic aspects into account when making recommendations.

We review the economic evidence and, where appropriate, carry out

economic modelling and analyses, using an NHS and personal social services

perspective.
