Possible areas for comment on the draft guideline

Does the guideline

- make recommendations about all the issues in the scope considered important by people affected by the guideline
- recommend treatments and care that people affected by the guideline might not agree with
- recommend actions or activities that people affected by the guideline might find unacceptable
- promote equality of opportunity relating to age, disability, gender, gender identity, ethnicity, religion and belief, sexual orientation or socioeconomic status, and could this be improved
- identify the right organisations and individuals to take action
- include all the important evidence
- cover important gaps in the evidence in the research recommendations (these could include people's or the community's experience)
- include in the implementation section all the tools that will help to put the guideline into practice?

Do the recommendations:

- reflect what the evidence says about care and treatment or specific activities or approaches
- take account of people's choices and their preferences (if applicable)
- take account of the information and support needed by people affected by the guideline
- consider the specific needs of different groups (for example, children and young people and people from minority ethnic groups)
- use wording that is respectful to individuals and communities and is clear and easy to follow
- reflect the importance of different people and professionals working together?

Do you:

- agree with the recommendations (if not, please explain why)
 - think the Committee has interpreted and applied the evidence correctly (are there any potential inconsistencies or disagreements)
 - think there are recommendations or areas in the guideline that would be difficult to put into practice
 - think some recommendations will make a big difference to local services and if so which ones (for example, is a test or treatment available in some areas but not in others)?
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- How clear and easy to understand are the recommendations on a scale of 1 to 5, 1 being very unclear, 5 being very clear?
 - Are there any recommendations that aren't clear about what action to take?

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- Are you aware of any relevant evidence, within the inclusion criteria for each evidence review, that has not been identified by the guideline Developer that should inform the development of this guideline.
