One potential equality issue was identified by the patient organisation at scoping consultation. This was around cultural issues such as language barriers, or lack of familiarity with the healthcare system or support available from charities. It was put forward that this may lead to difficulties in accessing the specialist care required. This was considered by committee and is discussed in the guidance. The committee heard from clinical experts that as birch bark extract would likely not affect the number of visits a person with EB might make to specialist care units birch bark extract would not affect the health inequality issue described and this issue could not be taken into account in committee's decision making.

A similar issue was raised in the patient organisation submission and has been addressed by the committee.
