Definitions:

Stakeholders

External Assessment Group (EAG)

For NICE-EAGs

An independent academic group commissioned by NICE Health Technologies Programme that prepares a systematic review of the clinical and cost effectiveness of the technology(ies).

For NETSCC-EAGs

An independent academic group commissioned by the NIHR Evaluation, Trials and Studies Coordinating Centre (NETSCC) that prepares a systematic review of the clinical and cost effectiveness of the technology(ies).
