

## HTG133 - Laparoscopic insertion of peritoneal dialysis catheter

SNOMED CT provides clinical terms for entry into the patient record to record clinical information relevant to that encounter; the mandated classifications (OPCS-4 or ICD-10) provide a method to collect and aggregate data to allow accurate and consistent data analysis.

### Procedure and device:

#### SNOMED CT preferred term (concept ID)

Laparoscopic insertion of peritoneal dialysis catheter (438341004)

#### OPCS-4 code(s):

Depending on whether a permanent or temporary dialysis catheter is inserted, one of the following pairs of OPCS-4 codes is assigned:

**X41.1 Insertion of ambulatory peritoneal dialysis catheter**

**Y75.2 Laparoscopic approach to abdominal cavity NEC**

or

**X42.1 Insertion of temporary peritoneal dialysis catheter**

**Y75.2 Laparoscopic approach to abdominal cavity NEC**

**Note:** If an ambulatory peritoneal dialysis catheter is removed, this is classified to the following two OPCS-4 codes: **X41.2 Removal of ambulatory peritoneal catheter** and **Y75.2 Laparoscopic approach to abdominal cavity NEC**.

#### SNOMED CT preferred term (concept ID)
