NICE has said that 6 technologies can be used in the NHS for robot-assisted surgery for knee or hip replacements. The technologies are:

- ApolloKnee System
- CORI Surgical System
- Mako SmartRobotics
- ROSA Knee Solution
- SkyWalker Robotic-assisted technology
- VELYS Robotic-Assisted Solution.

The NHS is collecting more evidence for these technologies. So, you might be asked if details of your treatment can be collected as evidence. You can ask your healthcare professional about how your information will be stored and used.

Robot-assisted surgery is a type of surgery in which surgeons use robotic technologies. The surgeon uses a computer console to control the robotic arms and instruments. The robotic technologies support the work of the surgeon and provide real-time imaging and feedback. They may allow surgical procedures to be done more precisely than with conventional techniques.

Orthopaedic procedures include operations to treat problems with the bones, joints or muscles. The 6 technologies in this guidance can be used for total hip joint replacements, and partial and total knee joint replacements.

Is this treatment right for me?

- How well does it work compared with other treatments?
- What are the risks or side effects? How likely are they?
- How will the treatment affect my day-to-day life?
- What happens if the treatment does not work?

- How will my information be used, if it is collected?
