

IPG 122- Microwave ablation for atrial fibrillation in association with other cardiac surgery

Procedure and device:

SNOMED CT preferred term (concept ID)

Open microwave ablation of atrioventricular node (853991000000107)

OPCS-4 code(s):

K52.1 Open ablation of atrioventricular node

Or

K52.8 Other specified open operations on conducting system of heart

Note: The following code would be assigned in addition to one of the above codes:

Y11.6 Microwave destruction of organ NOC

If code **K52.8** is chosen, the site code **Z33.6 Atrium of heart** is assigned following **Y11.6**.

Note: Codes are for patients undergoing concomitant open-heart surgery.
