

## IPG 338 - Laparoscopic radical hysterectomy for early stage cervical cancer

SNOMED CT provides clinical terms for entry into the patient record to record clinical information relevant to that encounter; the mandated classifications (OPCS-4 or ICD-10) provide a method to collect and aggregate data to allow accurate and consistent data analysis.

### Procedure and device:

#### SNOMED CT preferred term (concept ID)

Laparoscopic radical hysterectomy (236891001)

#### OPCS-4 code(s):

One of the following OPCS-4 codes is selected:

**Q07.1 Abdominal hysterocolpectomy and excision of periuterine tissue**

**Q07.2 Abdominal hysterectomy and excision of periuterine tissue NEC**

**Q07.3 Abdominal hysterocolpectomy NEC**

**Q07.4 Total abdominal hysterectomy NEC**

One of the codes above is followed by the following OPCS-4 codes:

**Y75.- Minimal access to abdominal cavity**

AND

**T87.5 Excision or biopsy of para-aortic lymph node**

AND/OR

**T87.8 Other specified excision or biopsy of lymph node**

AND

**Y75.- Minimal access to abdominal cavity**

### Diagnosis or health condition:

#### SNOMED CT preferred term (concept ID)

Neoplasm of uterine cervix (123841004)

#### ICD-10 code(s):

**C53.- Malignant neoplasm of cervix uteri**

or

**C79.8 Secondary malignant neoplasm of other specified sites**
