

IPG688 - Cytoreduction surgery with hyperthermic intraoperative peritoneal chemotherapy for peritoneal carcinomatosis

The mandated classifications (OPCS-4 or ICD-10) provide a method to collect and aggregate data to allow accurate and consistent data analysis.

Procedure and device:

OPCS-4 code(s):

Note: Research indicates that 'Cytoreduction surgery' removes the maximum of visible tumour from the peritoneal cavity and may be performed along with the excision/resection of other organs where necessary.

'Cytoreduction' of the peritoneum is not specifically classifiable in OPCS-4, but would be assigned one of the following 'excision' of peritoneum codes, depending on the method of approach used.

T41.6 Excision of peritoneum

Or

T42.5 Endoscopic excision of peritoneum

Note: Heated chemotherapy is not specifically classifiable within OPCS-4. It is coded using the following code combination:

T48.2 Introduction of cytotoxic substance into peritoneal cavity

Plus

X72.- Delivery of chemotherapy for neoplasm

Note: If other organs are excised/resected in addition to the peritoneal cytoreduction, these procedures will require coding in addition.

ICD-10 code(s):

C78.6 Secondary malignant neoplasm of retroperitoneum and peritoneum
