Briefing

Age: The risk of developing GORD increases with age. However, in a UK GP database study, the incidence of GORD increased with age in both men and women until the age of 69 years, from which point the trend was reversed.

Sex: GORD is slightly more common in women than men.

Socioeconomic: There is some evidence to suggest that GORD is more likely to occur in socially disadvantaged people.

Disability: People with GORD may be covered by the Equality Act if their condition has had a substantial adverse impact on normal day to day activities for over 12 months or is likely to do so.
