Optilume is intended for men with recurrent bulbar urethral strictures. Some people may not identify as men but have a penis. Urethral strictures become more common in people over 55. Sex, gender reassignment and age are protected characteristics under the Equality Act (2010).

2. What is the preliminary view as to what extent these potential equality issues need addressing by the committee?

It is unlikely that these equality considerations would hinder access of the technology for any specific group.

3. Has any change to the draft scope been agreed to highlight potential equality issues?
