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2. Review question:

In people with stable COPD, what are the referral criteria (for example intact fissures) for lung surgery?

Nick Hopkinson, Committee member, gave an overview of procedures and materials used for lung surgery in people with stable COPD.

Jean Bennie (JB), technical analyst, presented the available clinical evidence for this review question for the committee's consideration. JB explained the next steps in the analysis to allow the review question to be answered and presented preliminary results. Ben Johnson (BJ), health economist, then provided an overview of the economic analyses conducted for this question.

The committee made six recommendations in this area.

3. Economic model update

Ben Johnson (BJ), health economist, provided an update of the economic model discussed at a previous meeting. BJ covered treatment pathways, adverse events, costs and health-related quality of life.

4. Review question:

In people with COPD, what factors (for example, viral infection) may cause an exacerbation?

Yolanda Martinez (YM), technical analyst, presented some of the available clinical evidence for this review question for the committee's consideration.

This review question will be revisited at a future meeting.

Joshua Pink, technical advisor, gave a brief summary of the discussions held and what is planned for the next meeting.
