One stakeholder commented on how 'migrant and asylum seekers are referenced as a special (but not a "protected") group but not refugees, rape victims, armed forces, veterans, prisoners, peacekeepers, emergency services, etc'. The response to the stakeholder highlights how the guideline considered inequalities relating to gender, sexual orientation, gender reassignment, age, homelessness, refugees and asylum seekers, illegal immigrants, undocumented workers and failed asylum seekers, people with neurodevelopmental disorders, people with coexisting conditions, and people who are critically ill. This list was expanded from the original one that was submitted during scope consultation, and so stakeholders have contributed to shaping how the guideline would look at inequalities during recommendation development.
