1. Welcome and objectives for the meeting

The Committee discussed the evidence for previous caesarean section – management of labour and made recommendations and provided a rationale for them.

The Committee discussed the evidence for breech presenting in labour – mode of birth and made recommendations and provided a rationale for them.
