Comments were raised by stakeholders on one of the research recommendations on the efficacy and safety of intensive interventions to lower blood pressure for people with acute intracerebral haemorrhage who are frail at presentation. Older age was mentioned in the rationale, and feedback suggested that the focus of the text was regarding frailty rather than age, which should not be conflated with fragility and should be treated as separate entities. The committee agreed with this feedback and the research recommendation and rationale were amended and framed on fragility only.
