1. Welcome and objectives for the meeting

The Chair welcomed the Committee members and attendees to the first meeting on Ulcerative Colitis and Crohn's Disease. The Committee members and attendees introduced themselves.

2. Confirmation of matter under discussion, and declarations of interest

The Chair confirmed that, for the purpose of managing conflicts of interest, the matter under discussion was the clinical and cost effectiveness of corticosteroids, aminosalicylates, immunomodulators and other relevant drugs vs. placebo, themselves and each other for the induction of remission in ulcerative colitis and to develop a recommended sequence strategy for drug treatment in induction of remission in ulcerative colitis.
