4.1 Have any additional potential equality issues been raised during the consultation, and, if so, how has the Committee addressed them?

Some stakeholders were concerned that we had used an age cut-off for surgery of 50 years. The cut-off is included in the US National Institutes of Health criteria for surgery. This guideline ensures that age is not a criteria for surgery and so gives equal access to consideration for surgery for all age groups. This is fully discussed in evidence report C. The committee emphasised that the consideration is more about life expectancy than age, as performance status is not necessary correlated with age in a linear way.

A stakeholder comment was received asking why there were not more women on the committee as the condition is more prevalent in women. The gender mix of the committee was raised at recruitment but there was an absence of female candidates. The majority of the populations in the studies were female and thus were judged by the committee to be applicable.
