Particular groups of women (women undergoing assisted conception, women aged over 35 yrs, women of west African ethnic origin, women with family history of multiple pregnancy) are more likely to have multiple pregnancies than others.

Other groups with potential equalities issues are:

- women who have difficulties communicating in English
- women with learning difficulties.

1.2 What is the preliminary view on the extent to which these potential equality issues need addressing by the Committee? For example, if population groups, treatments or settings are excluded from the scope, are these exclusions justified – that is, are the reasons legitimate and the exclusion proportionate?

The particular groups of women mentioned in 1.1 do not need special consideration as the guideline starts from the point at which a multiple pregnancy is identified. During the antenatal period all women should be given the care appropriate to their clinical needs, regardless of age or ethnic origin.

Women who have difficulties communicating in English and those with learning difficulties will require specific consideration regarding information provision and support.

Exclusions listed in scope: quadruplets and high order pregnancies. These exclusion criteria do not have any bearing on equality issues in the guideline.
