Item 3: Alec Martin, Systematic Reviewer, delivered a presentation on qualitative studies.

Item 4: Sridevi Kalidindi, committee member, delivered a presentation on National Bench-marking data for rehabilitation to help with RQ2.1 – What is the effectiveness of rehabilitation services compared with standard care?

The committee discussed what messages we should take from this data.

Item 5: Hilary Eadon, Guideline Lead, presented the list of review questions with expected dates for when the protocols and Evidence Reviews will be presented. Hilary also explained the possibility of a new question.

Item 6: Anuja Pandey, Systematic Reviewer, presented protocol 1.2 for discussion: What co-existing medical, social (including family, cultural and ethnicity), communication, neurodevelopmental, cognitive or mental health problems pose barriers for people with complex psychosis and related severe mental health conditions in accessing rehabilitation services?

The committee discussed the protocol and made some amendments.

Item 7: Anuja Pandey, Systematic Reviewer, presented protocol 3.1 for discussion: What principles should guide adjustment to standard treatments in the management of the underlying psychosis in people using rehabilitation services?

Item 8: Gillian Baird explained the possibility of an additional question that would help split up RQ1.2. The new question would be 1.3 – What coexisting medical, neurodevelopmental, cognitive and mental health conditions need to be considered when forming a rehabilitation plan for people with complex psychosis?
