### 1. Welcome, apologies, introductions and objectives for the meeting

The Chair welcomed the Committee members, review team and public observers to the seventh meeting on Behaviour change: digital and mobile health interventions.

The Chair informed the Committee that apologies had been received. These are noted above.

The Chair outlined the objectives of the meeting which were to finalise the guideline and equality impact assessment ahead of publication.

### 2. Confirmation of matter under discussion, and declarations of interest

The Chair confirmed that, for the purpose of managing conflicts of interest, the matter under discussion was digital and mobile health interventions effective at changing established behaviours relating to diet/physical activity, smoking, alcohol consumption and harmful sexual behaviour.

The Chair asked everyone to verbally declare any new interests.

Ian Basnett declared that he is currently supervising a student working on a Fitbit study to promote exercise amongst staff. No payment is involved.

The Chair, NICE team and committee were satisfied that this did not constitute a conflict of interest.

The Chair reminded the committee that Stephen Sutton, Felix Naughton and Toby Prevost were excluded from participating in smoking recommendation drafting as they have authored papers included in the evidence base for this review question.

<b>3. Discussion of stakeholder comments and review of changes</b>
<p>Catrin Austin, Technical Analyst led the group discussion to continue reviewing the stakeholder comments from the last meeting.</p> <p>The Committee reviewed changes made to the recommendations in the last meeting. The rationale for any additional change was discussed and the subsequent action agreed.</p>
<b>4. Prioritisation of research recommendations</b>
<p>Committee considered whether any of the discussions today or yesterday affect the recommendations for research and if any of these should be flagged as a priority.</p>
<b>5. Equality Impact Assessment</b>
<p>Catrin Austin, Technical Analyst led the discussion on the Equality Impact Assessment in relation to the Committee's work. Any necessary changes as a result of consultation feedback were discussed and agreed.</p>
<b>6. Lessons learnt for future guidelines</b>
<p>As this will be NICE's first guideline on digital interventions for behaviour change the team asked the Committee to consider how to approach this work moving forward given there has been some challenges, including the limited evidence base.</p> <p>These learning points may be adopted when the guideline is updated, or similar guidelines are commissioned in the future.</p>
<b>7. Summary of the day and next steps</b>
<p>The Chair summarised what had been covered throughout the day and advised that the NICE team would draft a response to all consultation comments and make any agreed changes to the guideline documents, before sending these to Committee for final review.</p> <p>An embargoed release of the guideline is due to go out to stakeholders week commencing 21 September for a factual accuracy check and the guideline is due to publish on 2 October (this was originally scheduled for August but has been pushed back whilst NICE prioritised it's COVID rapid guidelines and therapeutically critical guidance).</p>
