The impact on equality issues has been assessed during guidance development according to the principles of the NICE equality policy.

4.1 Have any additional potential equality issues been raised during the consultation, and, if so, how has the Committee addressed them?

Two consultees pointed out that ACS due to coronary artery dissection (SCAD) has not been covered. This pathology has a greater incidence in women. It is also far less common than ACS due to atherosclerosis. Management would be different and would require a further literature search on most of the questions considered in this update. In view of the relative rarity of the condition, and the delay this would entail for the rest of the guideline, the GC have added a note acknowledging that the guidance does not apply to SCAD but have not changed any recommendations.
