1.	Welcome and apologies	BW welcomed members to the first Guideline Development Group meeting for the Home Care topic. This was the first ever GDG meeting of the NICE Collaborating Centre for Social Care and the first social care guideline for NICE and the NCCSC, therefore was truly pioneering. Apologies were received from Bilgin Musannif (BMf), Max Wurr (MW) and Amanda Edwards (AE).	
2.	Introductions, aims of the day and declarations of interest	 BW outlined the aims of the day and GDG members introduced themselves, followed by members of the NCCSC project team and attendees from NICE. BW explained the importance of Declarations of Interest (DOIs) and explained that there would be a requirement at the beginning of each GDG meeting for members to declare any new interests. 3.	Developing guidance - the NICE perspective	JM presented an overview of the work of NICE and an introduction to the role of Social Care Guidelines. After the presentation, the group had an opportunity to ask questions. BM from the Public Involvement Programme (PiP team) gave a presentation on service user and carer involvement in guideline development and highlighted the importance of having these members on the group. After the presentation, the group had an opportunity to ask questions.

Introduction to the NCCSC	BA introduced the NCCSC as a collaboration led by SCIE, working with the Evidence for Policy and Practice Information and Co-ordinating Centre (EPPI), based at the Institute of Education (IoE); the Personal Social Services Research Unit (PSSRU) based at the London School of Economics; Research in Practice (RIP) and Research in Practice for Adults (RIPFA). The work of the NCCSC covers social care guideline development as well as dissemination and adoption products and activities for guidelines and quality standards.
