1. Welcome and objectives for the meeting

The Chair welcomed the committee members and attendees to the 26th meeting of the multiple obstetric guidelines update.

The Chair outlined the objectives of the meeting, which included reviewing guideline evidence and editorial changes to existing recommendations.

The Chair confirmed that, for the purpose of managing conflicts of interest, the matters under discussion were multiple obstetric topics including Intrapartum care (IPC).

3. Minutes of last meeting

The Chair asked the committee to confirm the minutes of the last meeting, and the committee confirmed that no changes were required.

4. Morning presentations

The Chair introduced Claire Maynard, Systematic Reviewer, who presented the clinical evidence for IPC Q7.1: What is the most effective position for birth in women with an epidural in situ? and IPC Q7.2: What is the most effective position for birth in women without an epidural in situ?

5. Afternoon presentations

Hilary Eadon, Guideline Lead, presented editorial changes to the recommendations on the monitoring of women with regional analgesia, in light of updated guidelines from the Association of Anaesthetists and the Obstetric Anaesthetists' Association and on drinking water, use of intravenous fluids and monitoring of urine output and fluid balance during labour to reduce the risk of hyponatremia.

6. Questions and discussions

The committee discussed the evidence on the most effective position for birth in women with and without an epidural in situ, and drafted recommendations.

The committee agreed editorial changes regarding the monitoring of women with regional analgesia and editorial changes regarding drinking water, use of intravenous fluids and monitoring of urine output and fluid balance during labour to reduce the risk of hyponatremia.
