1. Welcome, introductions and objectives for the meeting

The Chair welcomed the Committee members and attendees to the tenth meeting of the Stroke rehabilitation (update) committee.

The Chair informed the Committee that apologies had been received. These are noted above.

The Chair outlined the objectives of the meeting, which included: review evidence for robot assisted arm training and community participation interventions, discussion of methods for modelling the intensity of rehabilitation.

2. Confirmation of matter under discussion, and declarations of interest

The Chair confirmed that, for the purpose of managing conflicts of interest, the matters under discussion were robot assisted arm training, community participation interventions and intensity of rehabilitation.

The Chair asked everyone to verbally declare any interests that have arisen since the previous meeting.

JBe declared that she has taken up a three year clinical lectureship which involves research into post-stroke dysphagia interventions.

RP stated that she was on the data management and ethics committee for the Rogers study which is included in the robot assisted arm training review. RP was not involved in the study itself.

NM declared she attended a training session on management of spasticity which was delivered by Allergan.

EW previously declared involvement with the RATULS study which is included in the robot arm training review. It was confirmed that EW's involvement was limited to

securing the grant and planning the study, EW was not involved in the study itself.

The register of interests was reviewed prior to the meeting. The Chair and Guideline Lead confirmed that the interests declared did not prevent the attendees from fully participating in the meeting.

3. Evidence review: robot-assisted arm training

MZ and CS presented the evidence for the clinical and cost effectiveness of robotassisted arm training. The committee discussed the evidence and draft recommendations.

4. Model methods: Intensity of rehabilitation

CS gave a presentation on methods for developing a model for intensity of rehabilitation. CS will continue with the modelling work and present an update at the next committee meeting.

5. Evidence review: community participation interventions

GW and CS presented the evidence for the clinical and cost effectiveness of community participation interventions. The committee discussed the evidence and draft recommendations.

6. Role of the NICE editors

GH gave a presentation on the role of the NICE editors.

7. AOB

The possibility of publishing some guideline content or research recommendations prior to the full publication was previously raised and discussed by the committee at guideline committee meetings 7, 8 and 9. The committee revisited this topic at guideline committee meeting 10. RF reminded the committee that the request for interim publication was previously discussed within NICE at a guideline progress meeting and this is not feasible within current NICE processes, as reported to the committee at guideline committee committee meeting 9.

BH gave an update that members of the National Guideline Centre team met with members of the team developing the Stroke working party guideline.
