4.	<b>Review of the evidence: Effects of support models, frameworks and interventions to improve transition from children’s to adult services (Q4.5.5 &amp; 4.5.6) inc Economic evidence</b>	<p>KL provided an overview of the evidence from effectiveness studies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 14,925 hits in total</li> <li>• 11,510 excluded</li> <li>• 3,415 included</li> <li>• 15 evaluation papers</li> <li>• 12 systematic reviews</li> </ul> <p><u>Economic evidence</u></p> <p>There was limited economic evidence and MT welcomed any literature that the GDG might have that could help with the economics work. GDG to send these through to PT.</p> <p>MT will present options on prioritising areas for further economic analysis at the next meeting.</p> <p><u>Evidence to recommendations</u></p> <p>KL outlined the next steps:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. focus on evidence statements</li> <li>2. develop recommendations</li> <li>3. feedback and test out with wider GDG</li> <li>4. agree draft recommendations</li> </ol> <p>The evidence was split into 3 key themes: Social care, education and health. The GDG discussed each evidence statement in detail.</p> <p>KL explained that the next steps were for the GDG to focus on the evidence statements and develop some draft recommendations.</p>	<b>Action 2: GDG to send any helpful economic papers to PT.</b>

A plenary session was then held after where the group facilitators fed back the draft recommendations and key points.</p> <p>A scribe from each group captured the draft recommendations from both groups and these will be presented back to the GDG at a future meeting.</p>
