KL informed the GDG that there will also be an update search of all evidence later this year and we are also waiting for the Cochrane review.	
8.	Developing recommendations for Q4.5.3	The GDG drafted recommendations in two groups. Recommendations were drafted based on the evidence statements and were then shared with the rest of the group in the plenary session.
