



## NICE public health guideline on Community Engagement (NG44)

## **Relevant ongoing NIHR research**

The NICE public health guideline Community Engagement (NG44) includes details of the evidence that supports the recommendations. It also identifies gaps in the evidence and makes <u>recommendations for future research</u>. Guideline users may be interested to know about research already underway which may be of relevance to the topic of the guidance.
