8	What is the most clinically and cost-effective combination of pharmacological and non-pharmacological treatment for people with ADHD?
9	What factors do people with ADHD believe affect their adherence to pharmacological or non-pharmacological treatment for ADHD?
10	What principles should clinicians follow when discussing decisions to start, adjust, or discontinue pharmacological treatment for people with ADHD?
11	What are the clinical effects of withdrawing from pharmacological treatment for ADHD?
