<p>8</p>	<p>Recommendations and considerations to date- mental health & acute and maternity</p> <p>The PDG discussed the draft recommendations and considerations developed so far, and suggested revisions and additions</p> <p>Action: NICE team will add to and amend the draft recommendations in advance of the next meeting.</p> <p>PDG members proposed combining both sets of guidance, to cover acute, maternity and mental health care services and settings. There was no rationale for providing separate guidance.</p> <p>There are mental health beds and wards in acute hospitals. Mental health units may also be on acute hospital sites and have to abide by the same smoke free policy.</p> <p>Mental health patients/service users have equal rights to protection from environmental tobacco smoke. All secondary care patients, no matter what their reason for admission or diagnosis, deserve equality of access to stop smoking support.</p> <p>The PDG voted on combining the two sets of guidance. The majority were in favour. It was agreed that the title of the new combined guidance should include mental health services and that mental health services should be an important focus for communication and implementation when the guidance is published.</p> <p>Action: NICE team to look at the possibility of combining into one guidance</p>	<p>NICE</p> <p>NICE</p>
