3,4	<p>Economic model: Presentation of draft modelling report</p> <p>Evelina Bertranou presented the key findings of the review.</p> <p>Questions and discussion Discussion included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gaps in the evidence (particularly for mental health patients) and potential sources, along with analysis solutions • Multi component smokefree intervention and findings; including absenteeism of staff due to effects of smoking • Impact on staff productivity, once they have given up smoking and no longer take smoke breaks • Overall cost saving of providing smoking cessation therapies

5	<p>Association between smoking and mental health disorders - Presentation of key findings</p> <p>Jo Leonardi-Bee, UK Centre for Tobacco Control Studies at Nottingham University, gave a presentation of their key findings. There was time for questions and discussion.</p>	
6	<p>Prevalence of smoking in people with mental health problems</p> <p>Lisa Szatkowski, UK Centre for Tobacco Control Studies at Nottingham University, presented the work that was carried out as part of a wider review of smoking and mental health commissioned for a forthcoming report by the Royal College of Physicians.</p> <p>There was time for questions and discussion.</p>	
7	<p>Report of survey on women's smoking behaviour and attitudes in pregnancy- and potential expert testimony</p> <p>This was discussed and the key finding was that women expect/prefer cessation advice from their midwife.</p>	
8	<p>Ethical issues for smoking cessation and smoke free policies - Questions and discussion</p> <p>Richard Ashcroft Professor of Bioethics, School of Law Queen Mary, University of London gave a presentation, the main themes of which were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Smoking cessation and smokefree policies are just as important in mental health settings • The need for careful, integrated and planned care inclusive of smoking cessation in mental health care • The importance of addressing staff concerns and attitudes <p>There was time for questions and discussion.</p>
