



Anhydrous sodium thiosulfate for preventing hearing loss caused by cisplatin chemotherapy in people 1 month to 17 years with localised solid tumours

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Anhydrous sodium thiosulfate (Pedmarqsi) is available on the NHS. It is a possible treatment for preventing hearing loss caused by cisplatin chemotherapy. It is suitable for babies, children and young people (1 month to 17 years) with solid tumours that are localised (have not spread to other parts of the body).

Is this treatment right for me or my child?

Questions to think about

- How well does it work compared with other treatments?
- What are the risks or side effects? How likely are they?
- How will the treatment affect day-to-day life?
- What happens if the treatment does not work?
- What happens if the treatment is not wanted? Are there other treatments available?
