Advice

NICE is unable to make a recommendation about the use in the NHS of decitabine for untreated acute myeloid leukaemia because no evidence submission was received from Janssen. The company has confirmed that it does not intend to make a submission because there is unlikely to be sufficient evidence that decitabine is a cost-effective use of NHS resources in this population.

Information
