Avatrombopag for treating thrombocytopenia in people with chronic liver disease needing a planned invasive procedure

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Avatrombopag (Doptelet) is available on the NHS as a possible treatment for severe thrombocytopenia (that is, fewer than 50,000 platelets per microlitre of blood) in adults with chronic liver disease having a planned invasive procedure.

Is this treatment right for me?
