Ruxolitinib (Jakavi) is available on the NHS as a possible treatment for polycythaemia vera in adults who cannot tolerate hydroxycarbamide (also called hydroxyurea) or when the condition is resistant to it.

Is this treatment right for me?

- How well does it work compared with other treatments?
