



## Olaparib for maintenance treatment of BRCA mutation-positive advanced ovarian, fallopian tube or peritoneal cancer after response to first-line platinum-based chemotherapy

Olaparib (Lynparza) is available on the NHS. It is a possible treatment for high-grade (fast-growing) advanced ovarian, fallopian tube or peritoneal cancer in adults, if:

- · they have a BRCA mutation and
- the cancer has responded to 1 course of platinum-based chemotherapy.

## Is this treatment right for me?

- How well does it work compared with other treatments?
- What are the risks or side effects? How likely are they?
