No equality issues were identified at consultation. However, consultation comments from ID446 (Arsenic trioxide for treating acute promyelocytic leukaemia) identified a subgroup that is also potentially relevant in this appraisal: Jehovah's witnesses for whom chemotherapy is not suitable.

2. What is the preliminary view as to what extent these potential equality issues need addressing by the committee?

Blood support or haematopoietic stem cell transplantation are not acceptable to some religious groups such as Jehovah's witnesses these patients would receive best supportive care
