The percentage of patients with coronary heart disease, stroke or transient ischemic attack, diabetes and/or chronic obstructive pulmonary disease who have influenza immunisation in the preceding 1 August and 31 March.

Rationale

Offering influenza vaccination to people with the long-term conditions listed in this indicator is a current recommendation from the Chief Medical Officer and the Joint

Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation.

Specification

Numerator: The number of patients in the denominator who have influenza immunisation in

the preceding 1 August and 31 March.

Denominator: The number of patients with coronary heart disease, stroke or transient

ischemic attack, diabetes and/or chronic obstructive pulmonary disease.

Calculation: Numerator divided by the denominator, multiplied by 100.

Exclusions: None

Minimum population: The indicator would be appropriate to assess performance at

individual general practice level.
