	The Chair welcomed the observer, Jessica Fielding, to the meeting.	
	There were no members of public observing the meeting.	
2. Declarations of Interests	The Chair asked the LGRG if they had any additional declarations of interest.

3. Feedback on Briefings	Mike Kelly (MK) gave feedback on the publication of Walking and Cycling and Behaviour Change Briefings.	
	MK also gave feedback on the Spatial Planning briefing that has currently been paused. The group noted that a Spatial Planning Briefing would be very useful within local government. The group also noted that the use of social media can be useful within place making. The LGRG suggested that NICE might use the same evidence base but reframe the document in the future.	
	MK noted that NICE public health briefings will only be published if there is formally published NICE guidance on the topic.	
4. Process and Methods – Local Government Briefings	MK discussed the process and methods manual for the Local Government Briefings. MK noted that the pilot year of the Local Government Reference Group had come to an end and had been judged to be a success. MK noted that this revised manual will formally take effect from 1 st April 2013.	
	MK also noted that the process of drafting briefings will continue in the same form as in the pilot year, however Social Care briefings will be included in the remit in future. NICE will begin recruiting members with Social	

	Care expertise in the summer of 2013.

	MK informed the group that they would shortly be invited to remain as formal members of the LGRG.	
	It was noted that the manual now refers to "Local Government Briefings" instead of "Public Health Briefings".	
	MK formally thanked the LGRG for a successful year.	
5. Return on Investment - Consideration of the revised	Antony Morgan (AM) and Lesley Owen (LO) joined the meeting at 10.30am and presented the return on investment briefing and infographic.	
document and recommendations for amendment	The group were informed that the infographic design has been borrowed from the American Public Health Association, however it is currently only in draft format and will need to be passed through the NICE Communication team.	
	It was noted that this document will be helpful for communication purposes. The NICE team and communications team were asked to consider rewording the text in the red banner on page 2 of the infographic. It was suggested that previous briefings could be drafted in the same format.	
	The main briefing was discussed and a number of comments were made. It was suggested that the paper should be redrafted with simplified statements.
